There is an ongoing trend of both carfentanil and flualprazolam in the illicit supply of down (fentanyl) in the region. Most recently results from the Nelson area.

Risk

- The combination of carfentanil and flualprazolam greatly increases overdose risk.
- Carfentanil is an opioid that is 100 times stronger than fentanyl and carries a high risk of overdose.
- Flualprazolam is a benzodiazepine (benzo) that is more potent and longer lasting than other benzos. Benzos may cause heavy and long lasting sedation, loss of consciousness, and drowsiness.
- Naloxone will work to reverse Carfentanil overdose BUT does not reverse benzodiazapines. People may remain unconscious for extended periods.

In effect until: January 15 2022

No matter what or how you use (smoking, snorting, injecting) take steps to prevent overdose:

- Get your drugs checked find locations at drugchecking.ca
- Avoid mixing.
- Use with others around or at an Overdose Prevention Site (OPS).
- Start with a small amount.
- Carry naloxone and know how use it.
