# Health Effects of E-Cigarette Use: Project VECTOR Findings and Recommendations

In this webinar, Dr. Peter Selby will describe the methodology of Project VECTOR (Vaping and Electronic Cigarette Toxicity Overview and Recommendations) and share recommendations and resources for people who use or are thinking of using-e-cigarettes. In response to increased prevalence of vaping among Canadians, the Innovation, Nicotine and Tobacco, Research, Education Programming, Implementation and Digital Health Lab (INTREPID Lab) at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH) has released a new toolkit describing the health impacts of e-cigarettes across four key areas: cancer, cardiovascular health, dependence, and respiratory health. The VECTOR toolkit includes recommendations and guidance resources to inform decision-making for both healthcare practitioners and people who either use, or are thinking of using e-cigarettes. # World Health Organization guidance for best practices for clinical trials (WHO GCP)

Clinical trials have a central role in generating the evidence needed to inform the development and implementation of health interventions. This is because they can reliably determine whether a health intervention has any effect by ensuring that any biases or random errors inherent in the study design are small with respect to the expected treatment effect. The results have been transformative in advancing global public health. The intent of the 'World Health Organization guidance for best practices for clinical trials' document is to support implementation of universal ethical and scientific standards and strengthen the clinical trial ecosystem, with a focus on under-represented populations. It is also complementary to other good clinical practice initiatives. Join us for an overview presentation on the WHO document which spans all regions and nations and is applicable across all health product lines: any design, health intervention, purpose, setting and role. ## CANTRAIN CLINICAL RESEARCH INTERNSHIPS

Michael Smith Health Research BC partners with the Canadian Consortium of Clinical Trial Training (<u>CANTRAIN</u>), funded by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, to help increase clinical trials training, expertise and capacity in BC and across Canada. Through Clinical Trials BC, they also support the development of education materials and curriculum for CANTRAIN's training programs. Watch this <u>short video</u> to learn more about Health Research BC's partnership with CANTRAIN and available training streams.

The internship program for clinical research professionals and new investigators is a unique opportunity. The program integrates online training with experiential, engaged learning opportunities and expert mentorship. Interns upgrade their skills and gain valuable experience in clinical trial activities outside their own institutions.

Six awards of up to \$10,000 each are available to support BCbased individuals to intern at a Canadian-based clinical trials unit. Internships can be in the form of in-person, virtual or hybrid engagements. Funding may be used for protected time and/or travel expenses related to in-person engagements.
