What will be tested?

Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, HIV & Syphilis

If you test too soon after an exposure to an STI, you may not get an accurate result. If you are concerned about a specific sexual contact, we recommend testing at 3 weeks **AND** 3 months following your contact.

Use On Demand STI Testing when:

- It is part of your regular STI checkup, recommended every 3-6 months, especially when you have new or casual partners.
- You've had a change in your sexual activities.

Do NOT use On Demand STI Testing and see a healthcare provider if:

- You are having symptoms that you think could be an STI
- You had recent sexual contact with someone who has tested positive for an STI, and now you need to get tested and treated
- You want to access HIV Post-Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP) or emergency contraception
- You would like to speak to a nurse or doctor for any other reason

How do I get tested?

- 1. Fill out the lab form and choose any of the swab tests you would like added (see box for optional test(s) instructions).
- All of the preselected tests are recommended, but you can choose to cross out any test(s) you don't want.

Optional test(s) to add:

On the lab form check the option(s) that matches the type of sex you are having.

- √ Throat Swab My mouth on a partner's penis/external genitals or shared sex toy
- √ Vaginal Swab A partner's penis/external genitals or shared sex toy in my vagina/internal genitals
- √ **Rectal Swab** A partner's penis/external genitals or shared sex toy in my anus
- Give the lab form back to the lab assistant. They
 will collect your blood and give you instructions
 to collect your own urine and/or swab(s) in the
 bathroom. Swab instructions are posted in the
 bathroom.
- 4. You will **NOT** be seen by a nurse or doctor.

How do I get my results?

Do not call the lab that collected your tests, they will not have your results.

If your test(s) are **positive** you will be contacted by a nurse who will provide follow-up care and connect you with a provider for treatment.

If your test(s) are **negative** you will **not** be contacted.
